RESPONDING TO COMMUNITY NEED

Behavioral health "triage" clinicians are critical to Teen Health Connection's integrated care model.

Triage clinicians address daily questions and concerns from teens and family members, providing education and brief intervention. They help link teens to behavioral health services as necessary, including therapy with one of our behavioral health clinicians.

ASSESSMENTS FOR YOUTH IN FOSTER CARE

An **integrated medical home** delivers preventive care and healthcare services while conducting routine behavioral health screening and psychoeducation with licensed clinicians.

The Independent Psychological Assessment provides comprehensive assessments and service recommendations for youth entering child welfare custody.

Pre-custody assessments inform behavioral health services and residential placements to potentially prevent further child welfare involvement.

Pre-adoption case reviews and consultations help youth achieve permanency in adoptive homes by preparing their new families.



I'M REACHING A DIFFERENT PLACE OF HEALING

I've done therapy before, and it worked really well. But I still had trouble being around people and going to public places. Memories [of the assault] were still affecting me. After the first session of Brainspotting, I couldn't believe how different it felt. I processed things that I had not consciously thought about before. I've done three Brainspotting sessions total and I feel a huge shift in my thoughts and feelings. I'm reaching a different place of healing.

Brainspotting is an adaptation of the well-known evidence-based EMDR* treatment method and harnesses the brain and body's ability to self-heal. Having this treatment modality adds an important tool in our work with adolescents. We've been able to immediately use the method with our teens experiencing a wide range of challenges, and it's helping them experience and process their thoughts and feelings at a deeper level.





NOTE FROM OUR BOARD PRESIDENT


THE JOHNSTON-ZIEGLER SCHOLARSHIP


